### Toboggan Run

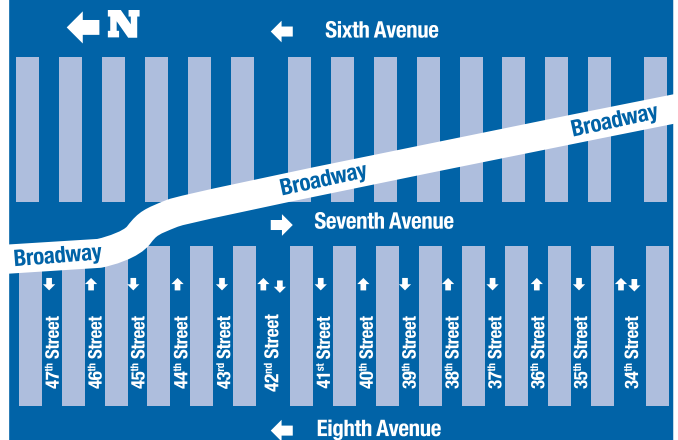
Where: Broadway between 40th and 41st Streets
