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TIMES SQUARE ARTS PARTNERS WITH BROOKLYN-BASED ARCHITECTURE FIRM MATTER PRACTICE ON *PEACE & QUIET*, ENCOURAGING DIALOGUE BETWEEN VETERANS AND CIVILIANS IN TIMES SQUARE

The Station opens on Veterans Day, November 11, and runs through November 16, 2012

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NEW YORK, N.Y. – November 1, 2012 – Brooklyn-based architecture firm **Matter Practice**, directed by **Sandra Wheeler** and **Alfred Zollinger**, is partnering with **Times Square Arts**, the public art division of the **Times Square Alliance**, on **Peace & Quiet**, a temporary dialogue station where veterans and civilians can openly engage each other in conversation in the heart of Times Square. The experience is intended to respectfully introduce empathy, compassion, and understanding between veterans and civilians. The Station will serve as a safe space for veterans and civilians to share a conversation--whether it be about conflict, separation from families, or unexpected issues that have arisen since returning home and reentering society.

The Station, located in Duffy Square, Broadway between 46th & 47th Streets, opens on Veterans Day, November 11, and runs every day from 12 – 8 p.m. through November 16. Conversations start on the hour and will last approximately 30 minutes.

"We are very proud to be partnering with Matter Practice on this very important project," said **Sherry Dobbin, Director of Public Art at the Times Square Alliance**. "Through an artistic intervention within our wonderfully chaotic public landscape, these architects have created a safe private space for veterans to share their experiences upon returning home."

"We initiated this project in part out of recognition that, although we considered ourselves informed citizens, we were completely segregated from any direct contact with the veteran community," states **Sandra Wheeler of MATTER.** "Discussions between civilians and veterans often fall prey to judgment, stereotypes, or bi-partisan politics simply because these two groups do not know enough about one another. Through conversations focusing on the human experience, we've been surprised to discover that there is significantly more common ground than one would think. These are the kinds of conversations we, as a civic society, need to have."

Working with organizations that support returning U.S. veterans, Times Square visitors can reserve their participation to have open discussions, bridging a gap between veterans and civilians. Veterans and civilians who are interested in participating can sign up by visiting the station located on Duffy Square, at the other end of Times Square from the U.S. Army recruiting station, or by phone or online:
