

Broadway community unites to celebrate Earth Day and demand climate action

The 2nd Annual *Broadway Celebrates Earth Day* concert returns to Times Square

New York, New York - April 11, 2023 - The Broadway Green Alliance and Times Square Alliance present the second annual *Broadway Celebrates Earth Day* concert on Saturday, April 22nd from 10am - 3pm ET in Times Square. A landmark activation and celebrity showcase, the concert will be live streamed by **Stars in the House**. This unique star-studded concert will feature live performances from Broadway's top talent, young performers from the tri-state area, and family-friendly activities to accomplish the green needs on #BroadwaysToDoList. The concert will be held on Broadway between 45th and 46th Streets, kicking off the NYC Department of Transportation's "Car-Free Earth Day."

Broadway performers and hosts joining the event include **Seth Rudetsky and James Wesley** (*Stars in the House*), **Tony Award Nominee Anika Larsen** (*Almost Famous*), **Philippe Arroyo** (& *Juliet*), **Mara Davi** (*A Chorus Line*), **Jordan Dobson** (*Bad Cinderella*), **Laurel Harris** (*Jagged Little Pill*), **Alli Mauzey** (*Kimberly Akimbo*), **Michael James Scott** (*Aladdin*), **Jason Tam** (*Be More Chill*), **Alysha Umphress** (*On The Town*), and more to be announced. Young performers from across the region will take the stage in the afternoon, including students from Cassie Okenka Voice Studio, Epic Players, Marymount Manhattan College, New York City Children's Theatre, Perkiomen Valley High School, R.Evolución Latina, and Wolf Performing Arts Center. **David Alpert** serves as the director of the event and Rick Hip-Flores provides musical accompaniment.

Leading up to the concert, the Broadway Green Alliance is also hosting a free **Textile Recycling Drive** on Wednesday, April 12th from 11am - 2pm ET in the center of Duffy Square. In partnership with **Wearable Collections**, the recycling drive is open to all shows, theatres, industry members, fans, and neighbors as part of a collective effort to reduce textile waste. Items accepted during the drive include used and clean clothing, shoes, curtains, hats, linens, towels, handbags, and belts.
